Bethany

Lazarus Home for Girls and the Jeel al-Amal Home for Boys side by side in Bethany are now very isolated on the “other” side of the Jerusalem separation wall. Our visits and financial support are crucial to their existence.



Bethlehem

Many pilgrim parties have a lunch stop at the **Bethlehem Arab Society for Rehabilitation (BASR)** where Edmund Shehadeh and his team work hard to enhance the quality of life of children in great need.



Also in Bethlehem, Helen Shehadeh, Edmund’s sister, looks after the **Al-Shurooq School for Blind Children**. We are truly privileged to share in the vision of this remarkable family working in the most difficult of circumstances.

Together we aim to leave a positive footprint on the paths we travel.

The McCabe Educational Trust was the initiative of Alistair McCabe and launched in 1991 by the Archbishop of Canterbury at Lambeth Palace. Since then grants of over £1 million have been made to inspiring people we have met on pilgrimage. As “the haves” encounter the “have-nots”, the Trust has become a practical tool for one to help the other. A brief meeting of minds has often been transformed into a long-term financial and emotional partnership.
